Transforming the way in which we are cared for at the end of our lives is at the heart of the Marie Curie Delivering Choice Programme.

Research shows that 64 per cent of us would want to die at home if we were terminally ill. However, the reality is that only 25 per cent of us will achieve our wish, with around half of us dying in hospital – the place we least want to be.

The Marie Curie Delivering Choice Programme is a pioneering initiative in Leeds and two other UK locations which aims to double the number of people able to die at home.

Working in partnership with local health and social care providers, the programme assesses existing palliative care services before designing and implementing new ways of working to ensure more terminally ill people can be cared for at home.

In Leeds four new service models have been approved and four more are in the final stages of development. Those approved so far are:

- A dedicated palliative care ambulance to ensure patients at the end of their lives can get home exactly when they need to.
- Enhancing support in care homes by employing three specially trained members of staff to improve standards and enhance the provision of palliative care.
- An ethnic minorities link worker to focus on understanding the needs of patients and carers from a variety of ethnic minority communities across Leeds, and improving their access to palliative care services.
- An education and training co-ordinator to provide better skills to healthcare professionals involved in end of life care.

The success of the programme is being independently monitored and audited by a specialist team from Lancaster University.

The Marie Curie Delivering Choice Programme in Leeds will give more people the choice to be cared for and die at home across the city.
